"European ambitions for Livestock and Dairy"

Professor **Roel Jongeneel** from the Wageningen University (NL) set the scene of the conference by presenting the potential impacts of the EU Green Deal and its Farm to Fork strategy for the European livestock and dairy sector. He started off with a very clear status quo analysis of both today's strengths and today's problems of the European lactopshère.

Mr Aleš Irgolič concluded with a positive outlook for the EU dairy sector that delivers excellence of unrivalled nutritious qualities in an affordable way to citizens in Europe and beyond.



The European Commission's approach

Mr Lukáš Víšek from the cabinet of First Executive Vice President Frans Timmermans mastered the challenging mission of confronting the dairy sector with the approach taken by the EU Commission.

He caught the audience by his analysis of the size of the environmental challenges we undoubtably face today. He acknowledged the efforts done by the EU dairy sector so far, but also remarked "the need to accelerate and speed up the process – and that is the objective of the Green Deal."

The question of a potential loss of competitivity, both within the EU Single Market and in the international trade arena, is taken very seriously by the EU Commission. "Today, the reality of the climate crisis is recognized by the whole international community, and we are in the process of joining forces with partners across the world that have similar strategies in mind."

FrieslandCampina: "Frontrunners" towards sustainability

"Back in 2010 we started to roll out our FrieslandCampina strategy to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and we are the frontrunners in handing out to our farmers a tool to monitor their farm biodiversity progress," stated Ms **Hester Maij**, Corporate Director Public & Regulatory Affairs at FrieslandCampina. As a cooperative operating in 38 countries, we have a clear strategy to play our role to achieve the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

But, as she highlighted, there is no 'one size fits all' approach, not even within the European Union. A customized approach is needed to define sustainable agri-food production, which is different for instance from organic farming, that has an at least partially other overall objective.

In the podium discussion the need for a scientific assessment of all legislative steps seemed to be a consensus position.

"If there is scientific proof that mandatory national origin labelling will bring environmental benefits, we will for sure reconsider our EDA position. The set-up of any EU environmental labelling must take into consideration the Product Environmental Footprint (PEF) methodology that has been approved by the EU Commission and all Member States. When it comes to nutritional labelling, the unrivalled nutritious value of milk and dairy simply cannot be neglected", stated EDA secretary general Alexander Anton.
