EU-NZ Free Trade Agreement: towards the finishing line under the French EU Presidency

With the scheduled working visit of the New Zealand Minister for Agriculture and Trade **Damien O'Connor** in Brussels in June, followed – end of June - by New Zealand Prime Minister **Jacinda Ardern** at the end of June, chances are that the EU – New Zealand Free Trade Agreement (FDA) will be signed under the French EU Presidency.

In our discussions with our New Zealand partners and with the European authorities (see our latest <u>EDA Dairy</u> <u>Flash</u>) we underlined the concerns of the so-called 'sensitive sectors'.

The chairperson of the European Parliaments' Agricultural Committee, **MEP Norbert Lins** (EPP, Germany) underlined: "In my regular exchanges with the EU Commission on all the different ongoing trade negotiations, I made it very clear: in today's geopolitical environment, the European trade policy is of critical strategic importance. Trade agreements must be tailored in a fair trade and level playing field spirit, that must resonate within our European farming community and our food sector. The COMAGRI will assess all FTAs against these criteria."

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EDA knocks. Washington DC answers

EDA's visit to Washington DC (see also our EDA Dairy Flash 7) has paid out its dividend as EU exports of infant formula to the U.S. ramp up. The EDA delegation, led by EDA President **Giuseppe Ambrosi**, met with multiple stakeholders including the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and politicians from both sides of the political spectrum. Discussions also touched on how Europe could assist the U.S in resolving their **infant formula shortage**.

The U.S. normally produces around 98% of its domestic infant formula demand but a dent in the supply chain of one of the largest manufacturers kicked off an increasing shortage. The U.S. market for infant formula is traditionally protected by extensive tariff and non-tariff barriers, making it extremely difficult for foreign suppliers to enter the market and keep shelves filled in case of domestic shortages. Our EDA delegation highlighted the capability of the EU dairy industry to tackle U.S. shortages by providing a steady supply of EU infant formula, which guarantees the highest quality standards globally.

"We explained to our American friends that we stand ready to help, but that this would require cutting some protectionist tape" stated **Conor Mulvihill** (Dairy Industry Ireland), member of the EDA delegation to Washington DC. "The fact that the FDA only days later announced guidance outlining increased flexibilities regarding the importation of certain infant formula products to further increase the availability means that our offer didn't fall on deaf ears."

It's now time to use this momentum and to let the European dairy industry be a permanent part of the solution.

Arla Foods inaugurates a new milk powder tower in Pronsfeld, Germany

On 31 May, Arla Foods celebrated the opening of their second drying tower in Pronsfeld (Germany) with Lillie Li Valeur (Arla Foods Germany CEO), Peder Tuborgh (Arla Foods CEO) and Minister Daniela Schmit, inaugurating this way one of the most technologically advanced dairy sites in Europe.



The new powder tower can produce 90,000 tonnes of high-quality milk powder per year, with its products to be exported to around 70 countries around the world, with a focus on markets such as the Middle East, West Africa and Southeast Asia, where the demand for affordable, nutritious dairy products exceeds local production and local supply.

The inauguration of Pronsfeld's drying tower is equipped with the latest technology to ensure environmental, social, and economic sustainability, adding value to the work of dairy farms across borders.

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World Milk Day celebration in Madrid: The contribution of the dairy sector in times of uncertainty

In the framework of the celebration of the World Milk Day, yesterday EDA attended the 63 edition of the World Milk Day event organized in Madrid by our Spanish member FeNIL.

The event counted with the presence of the Spanish Minister of Industry, Trade and Tourism, Ms. **Reyes Maroto**, major processors, retailers and distributors, and consumer organisations.

The conference highlighted the state of play of nowadays' challenges and opportunities of the Spanish and European dairy sector, with enriching discussions in topics such as the added value of dairy chains to society in the current scenario where the European Green Deal and Farm to Fork strategy are shaping the policy making process, the importance of the nutritious value of dairy products in balanced diets, and the need of implementing measures aiming to attract new generations to farm, live and work in rural areas.
