EU Parliament's COMAGRI on Ukraine mission

Next week, **MEP Norbert Lins (EPP, Germany)** will lead a COMAGRI delegation to meet with representatives and national authorities at the Polish -Ukrainian border.

In this completely new environment, we simply need to get a first-hand insight into the overall situation at every level. And we want to look ahead: short and mid-term, we need to see how to mitigate the harvest and food losses in and for Ukraine. Then, we also want to discuss the long-term outlook of the agri-food sector in Ukraine," stated MEP Norbert Lins (EPP, Germany).

Guest speaker **Dimitri Barbe** closed the meeting with an inspiring presentation on how to communicate sustainability.

EU Promotion Policy: Concerns over delays in the publication of the Commission Revision proposal

Lack of clearance in the EU Promotion Policy Revision publication date. In the framework of the Farm to Fork (F2F) strategy, the revision process of the EU Promotion Policy was launched last year with the expected publication date of the legislative proposal between January and March of 2022. However, we have been informed that this publication might be delayed and European dairy, as part of the policy, is concerned about this delay.

In a letter sent last 17 May to the EU Commissioner for Agriculture and Rural Development Janusz Wojciechowski, EDA together with 11 agri-food sector organisations, pointed out that any delay to the publication of the proposal would seriously jeopardise the success of the EU Promotion Policy in achieving its original main objective, the competitiveness of EU agricultural products and a greater contribution to sustainable food production and consumption. In fact, this delay first risks further discrimination against specific food products in the 2023 Annual Working Program (AWP), and secondly risks discouraging producers from applying for promotion programmes due to uncertainty.

In the current context marked by the war in Ukraine and the Covid-19 pandemic recovery, we believe that the need for the EU agri-food sector to benefit from some certainty and to have access to a promotion policy creating market opportunities is especially important. Therefore, we highly encourage the European Commission to publish its proposal for an inclusive EU Promotion Policy by the end of June as originally intended.

CAP Strategic Plans: Steady development

The new CAP implementation keeps developing smoothly. Last 18 March the EU Commission received the last draft national strategic plans pending from some member states. In parallel, DG AGRI services sent on 31 March the observation letters on the 19 draft CAP strategic plans delivered last December 2021.

These letters, which can be read <u>here</u>, identify elements of the plans that require further explanation and/or adjustment before the EU Commission is in a position to approve the plans. For those member states without the recommendation/adjustment letter by March (Slovakia, Rumania, Bulgaria, Germany and Belgium), they received their letters by 9 June. Additionally, in accordance with the expected timeline, last 13 May in the Civil Dialogue Group meeting of the CAP (attended by EDA), the EU Commission's DG AGRI's Director General Wolfgang Burtscher highlighted that the expected date for the adoption of the national strategic plans is set for September 2022. Nevertheless, he also pointed out that there could be a delay in the process, so in that case the plans would be adopted in December 2022.
