## CEO's discuss the "Whey forward"

The first day continued with leading CEOs of global-whey processing companies: James Neville (Volactive, UK), Herman Ermens (Royal FrieslandCampina, NL), David Lenzmeier (Milk Specialties Global, U.S.A.), Wytse Vellema (Ausnutria, China), and Mike Bones (Fonterra, NZ), laying out the opportunities and challenges the industry will face in the coming years.

In the words of **James Neville**: 'The industry has matured since the first International Whey Conference in the 1980s. The industry is bustling, but the consumer has matured as well. Whey protein is now not only for athletes but also for the general consumer, especially those over the age of 50.

# "This is the Whey!" – Our research & innovation for the food and feed industry

EWPA Vice President Benno van Mersbergen (RFC, NL) chaired our 'Whey Leaders Panel' with the Head of Research at AFI, Niels Østergaard (Arla Foods, DK), and Richard Bradfield, the General Manager International Ingredient Corporation (U.S.A), Chief Medical Officer at ByHeart (U.S.A.) Dr. Devon Kuehn, a science-based newcomer in the infant formula segment, shared the latest insights on their specific health research. Dr. Jonathan Lane (Health & Happiness Group, CN) emphasized the yet-to-be fully tapped whey protein wellness potential for humans and (pet) animals. On the feed side, Arjan Gobius du Sart (Denkavit, NL) highlighted the importance of dairy and whey proteins for livestock feeding.

"While we have made some incredible progress in deepening our knowledge on the protein side, this research and innovation journey will continue—and we will have to explore the science on other whey ingredients, products and more" concluded **Benno van Mersbergen**.

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## Honouring Professor Patrick Fox

For this conference we named one of the conference halls in tribute to late Professor Patrick Fox, one of Irelands' most distinguished scientists, who passed away recently.
